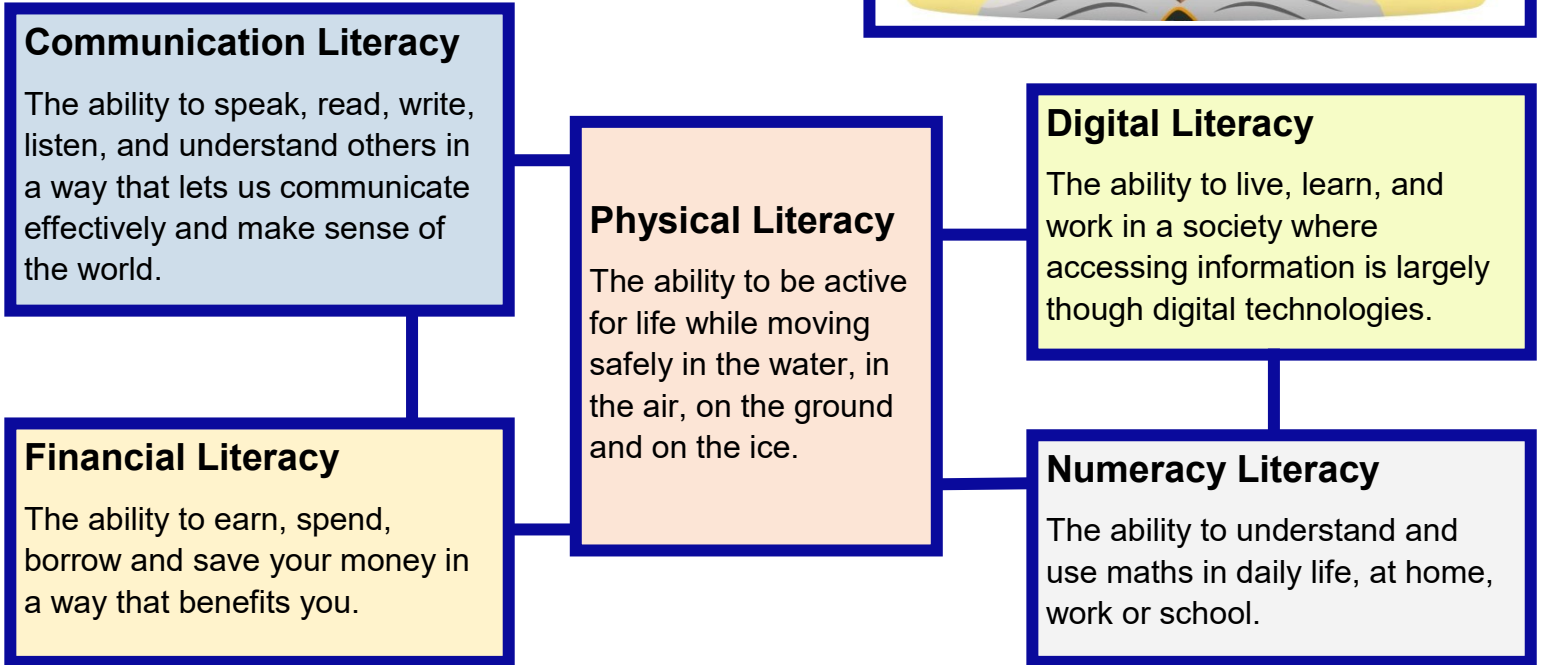


What is Literacy?
